Amicus Curiae Blog Submission/Short-Form Articles

WHAT IT IS

Amicus Curiae blog posts/short-form articles address timely issues or current events in the law. Longer articles that do not meet the requirements for Longform Articles may be considered for publication as a series of posts through *Amicus Curiae* at the discretion of the *Law Review*.

LENGTH

Amicus Curiae blog posts/short-form articles are typically between 1,500 and 4,000 words in length and must rely on academic-quality sources.

FORMAT

We request that all *Amicus Curiae* blog posts/short-form articles submitted for consideration be composed in Microsoft Word, double-spaced, and with footnote citations that conform to *A Uniform System of Citation* (20th ed. 2015) [“the *Bluebook*”]. In matters not addressed by the *Bluebook*, submissions should conform to *The Chicago Manual of Style* (16th ed. 2010).

WHAT TO SUBMIT FOR CONSIDERATION

1. Your original *Amicus Curiae* blog post/short-form article.
2. A statement of *Amicus Curiae* blog post/short-form article topic, including the following:
 - a. Topic
 - b. Thesis statement; and
 - c. 150–200 word summary of your submission.
